RICK'S REFLECTIONS

Deuteronomy 26:5 says, "A wandering Aramean was my ancestor." An earlier translation rendered it, "A wandering Aramean was my father." I can relate to that sentiment because a wandering Petroleum Engineer was my father. In my younger days, my father was frequently transferred. In fact I lived in five different communities before my fourteenth birthday. When Exxon wanted to transfer my father to Perth, Australia, during my senior year of high school in New Orleans, my father (probably with some strong "encouragement" from my mother) finally declined.

My parents had been lifelong members of First Methodist Church in Tulsa, Oklahoma, but after they married and settled in Seminole, Oklahoma, they said they felt at home in the Presbyterian church there. In my childhood memories there were two constants no matter where we moved: Dad's co-workers and their families who moved to the same locations and a Presbyterian congregation that welcomed us and nurtured us in the faith.

When Debbie, Greg, and I first visited UPC, we felt that same hospitality that I remembered receiving as a newcomer during my childhood. We have always felt at home here. Debbie and Greg were both ordained as church officers, and UPC youth groups and college group were a second family for Greg. Over the years, when I have not been preaching elsewhere on Sundays, UPC has been a place where my soul has been fed through worship and pastoral care and by the wonderful opportunity I have had to lift my voice in song with the UPC choir.

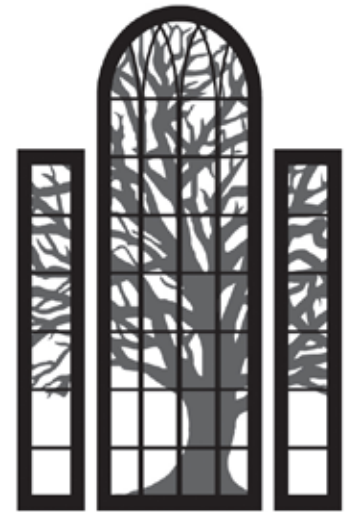

It's been a while since I've preached and led worship in the same place every Sunday, since I've been in specialized ministry for the last 25 years as a hospital and hospice chaplain and as a counselor. A few things have also changed since my first pastorate began in Jennings, Louisiana, in 1976. For example, I go back to the days when bulletins were typed on mimeograph stencils and the office telephone had a rotary dial. Your hospitality, though, has remained constant, and I greatly appreciate the kind words so many of you have expressed as we begin this journey of reflection and learning together.

Welcome! Interim Pastor, Rick Pitcher

Rick is a retired PC(USA) Teaching Elder who has been a member of the Presbytery of South Louisiana since his ordination in June 1976. A native of Oklahoma, he grew up in New Orleans, graduated from LSU and Union Theological Seminary in Richmond, VA, and served as pastor of churches in Jennings, New Orleans, and Baton Rouge. After returning to New Orleans in 1985, he met his wife, Debbie Abernathy, who was finishing her post-residency fellowship at Tulane Medical School. Following the birth of their son Greg, Rick began clinical training as a chaplain and counselor and received a master's degree in Marriage and Family Counseling from Our Lady of Holy Cross College in New Orleans in 1996. Following their move to Baton Rouge in 1993, Rick served as chaplain at The Medical Center of Baton Rouge, stated supply pastor at Trinity Presbyterian Church, and chaplain and grief counselor at The Hospice of Baton Rouge. He is also a Licensed Professional Counselor. Rick and his family have been active in the life of UPC since the 1990s. When not preaching elsewhere on Sundays, Rick sings in the choir and occasionally teaches in the Parks Wilson class. In retirement he has taught OLLI classes for LSU on *A History of New Orleans Jazz and Louisiana Music and the Artists Who Created It* in addition to pursuing his passions for LSU sports, travel, photography, music, and trains and railroad history.

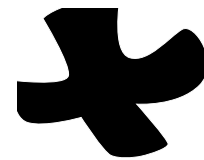

Started in 1949, One Great Hour of Sharing is a long-standing ecumenical effort aimed at raising the funds necessary to provide relief and reconstruction for communities in the aftermath of disaster. What started as an hour-long radio appeal has evolved over the years, varying from eight to 29 participating denominations, and has become the most participated-in Offering in the PC(USA). Today, projects supported by One Great Hour of Sharing are underway in more than 100 countries.

- Works within communities as they recover and find hope after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters
- Receives 32% of funds raised

Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP)

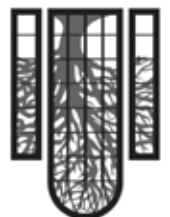
