hospitality unfolding

My, how time flies! It seems like only yesterday that we submitted the sabbatical leave grant proposal for Patti to the Lilly Foundation. Well, it has been a year. Little did we know that the theme of Christian hospitality in our grant proposal would once again be front and center as we opened our Hospitality Hall for the many groups we are welcoming to aid in rebuilding after the devastating floods of August. The Sabbatical Leave Planning Committee began to meet in November to plan church activities while Patti is away. We explored how we could include the theme of hospitality in our small group studies, how the youth group could be involved, and whom we might bring in as guest speakers/preachers. And now we are at the mid-point of our sabbatical (Patti's and the church's). So what's next?

We have three dedicated ministers in April, May and early June. Tina DeYoe, a Unitarian minister from Los Alamos, New Mexico, was our first, preaching on April 30th. During the church school hour that day, Tina, along with Stevie Demarest, shared stories of their work with Borderlinks in Tucson, Arizona, and the continued need for hospitality on the Mexican border.

On May 7th, Shawn Anglim of First Grace United Methodist Church in New Orleans will be here to preach and talk about his experience as part of two churches in New Orleans that combined after Hurricane Katrina.

On May 14th, during our last church school class for the year, we invite you to join us for an introspective discussion about UPC and Christian hospitality. What did the small groups learn about hospitality? How has Hospitality Hall been going? What is your reaction to the ideas our guest preachers and teachers shared?

Our final guest preacher on June 4th is Jason Santos, the National Director of Ukirk Collegiate Ministries. We will delve into how we can embody hospitality as a church called to serve a university community.

Our sabbatical has been and continues to be a time of exploration of the meaning of Christian hospitality, both giving and receiving. We are challenged to expand our hospitality beyond our current thinking. What will it look like? What is our role as Christians to include the "other"?

Join us for provocative discussion during the second half of our sabbatical!

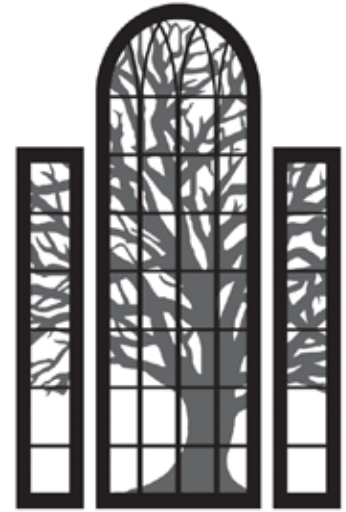

GUEST PREACHER MAY 7

Pastor Shawn Moses Anglim is the founding pastor of First Grace UMC--the merger of a historically Black church and a historically white church in the wake of Hurricane Katrina. He asked the two congregations, "In this moment, do you believe we can do more for our city as one body of Christ, more than we could ever do as two bodies of Christ one long mile apart?" He is also the founding Executive Director of First Grace Community Alliance and its two missions- Hagar's House--a residence for women and children, and Project Ishmael--a legal clinic for Latino/a children. Anglim has been featured in the Christian Century podcast, Preachers on Preaching, and was a Keynote speaker for the Association of Theological Schools Conference on Preparing Seminarians to serve in the 21 Century Church. He is also a member of the Times Picayune Editorial Advisory Board. He and his wife, Anne Daniell, were part of the founders group that fought for Morris Jeff Community School-- an open enrollment public charter school. They have two children both of whom attend Morris Jeff. Anglim is a graduate of Harvard Divinity School and Drew Theological School.

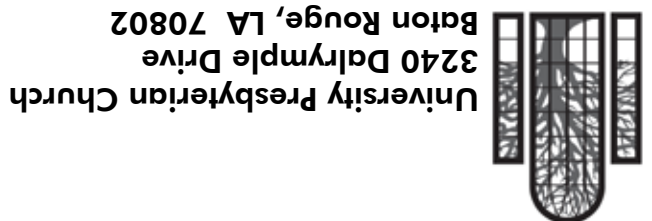
