*How can we keep from singing?*

*My life flows on in endless song, above earth's lamentation.  
I hear the clear, though far-off hymn that hails a new creation.  
No storm can shake my inmost calm while to that Rock I'm clinging.  
Since Christ is Lord of heaven and earth, how can I keep from singing?  
-My Life Flows On, Robert Lowry*

My first guitar was a beat-up old Yamaha acoustic that originally belonged to my uncle. His wisdom was for me to start learning how to play on a guitar that would make me have to work hard. After months of practice and sore fingers, my hard work on that beat-up guitar began to pay off once I could play a song all the way through. Playing guitar quickly became an outlet for me in my challenging moments of my youth. I played and sang when I was feeling sad or joyful. Music had become a deep part of my identity, an endless song, as Robert Lowry's 1869 hymn expresses. We actually used this hymn during our wedding service! Probably no coincidence my wife, a wonderful musician herself, is named "Melody."

So many of my memories from my five years at UPC have to do with music: hearing the choir sing so beautifully every Sunday morning, Kelly Kerr's Good Friday solo as the lights go out, playing instruments and singing with youth, adults, and children in church services, VBS, and retreats.

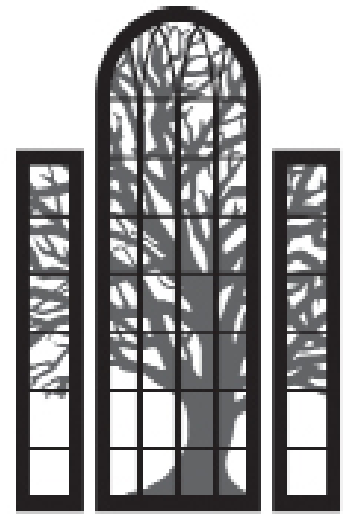
Much has happened in my five years of serving at UPC. My first couple of years were defined by constant shifting around as construction took place. Some dear members have passed away, and we have also celebrated new births. I have had the deep joy of seeing youth grow up and mature into adults. We have witnessed our denomination becoming more open and inclusive. We faced the literal and metaphorical storms of last summer together – flooding and the shootings. Through all of these hard times and joyful moments, you have continued your song. UPC can't keep from singing because you believe in the grace of Jesus Christ.

When singing becomes difficult, know that all music takes practice. Sometimes you've got to beat around on an old acoustic guitar before a song can come forth. Don't think you don't have a song within you either. We are all part of God's endless song, that carries on in the midst of a tumultuous world. Lowry's hymn invites us to use our voices in grateful response in the midst of the pain of this world. I don't believe this is an invitation to ignore the struggles around us, but rather to engage them, rooted in God's liberating grace, and alongside those joining you in song.

As Melody and I transition to Atlanta, we will continue our song in a new community of faith. Every time we think back on our wonderful years with UPC, we won't be able to stop the song of gratitude that will pour forth. We have experienced the love of Christ from you in so many ways and at so many times. May that song continue to come forth until the next time we are together. How can we keep from singing?

### Fishing for Missions.....

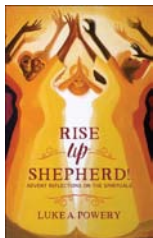

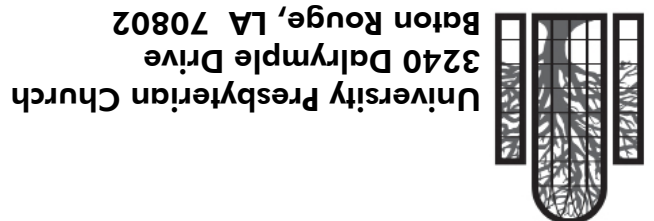
