John's vision of the realm of God includes the pronouncement, "Behold, I am making all things new!" (Revelation 21:5) One of the ways that our tradition is in consort with this image is in our understanding of ourselves as those who not only were once reformed (as in during the Reformation of the 16th century) but who are always being reformed. At our best we live this understanding out not by being in favor of change just for change's sake but by acknowledging that God's Holy Spirit, the sacred in our midst, is always creating, initiating, inviting, and leading us toward new things.

It is one of the beautiful things about who we are. It can also be one of the most challenging.

Many of you are beginning to ask, "How's the search for a new Associate Pastor going?" or some other question linked to the forward movement of our life in community together. So it seems the time to get all of you a bit up to date on what's going on.

When Associate Pastor Mike Watson left in late November the Session and Diaconate were already deep in conversation regarding a potential change in the leadership structure (i.e. the roles and relationships of the Deacons and Elders) of the congregation. Mike and I had been in discussion about the need to reinvigorate congregational participation in ministry while being sensitive to the changing needs, gifts, and contexts of younger adults who – thanks be to God - are increasing in numbers at UPC. This fall the Personnel and Administration Committee was also at work getting staff position descriptions and committee responsibilities updated. In addition, in the Presbyterian Church, when a Pastor leaves, congregations are encouraged to engage in some sort of mission study so that through shared reflection the congregation can be ready to call a new pastor with a clear understanding of church identity, expectations, and vision. UPC had not done such a study since prior to my arrival in the spring of 2002.

Due to all these factors the Session decided to engage, with the Deacons and with the leadership of Ann Philbrick (a Presbyterian minister living in New Orleans and an experienced church consultant) ,in a conversation about the dynamics of church life in our country at the moment (including generational dynamics) and at UPC in particular. This was done at our annual retreat in early February. The conversation was rich and productive.

As result of all the preparatory conversations and work, at its February meeting the Session voted, upon the recommendation of the task group working for some time on the role of the Deacons, to move the three diaconate committees to the session. This will streamline communication. The Deacons will continue to serve as leaders in ministries of compassion at UPC and to serve on committees; however, they will not have regular board meetings. They have elected Lois Kuyper Rushing as their moderator. Lois' role will be to attend session meetings and to communicate with the other deacons any needs or requests that come up.

In addition, at that same session meeting, approval was granted to explore contracting with Ann Philbrick to offer for us various models for mission study and to get us going on that process. We are currently working on these directives.

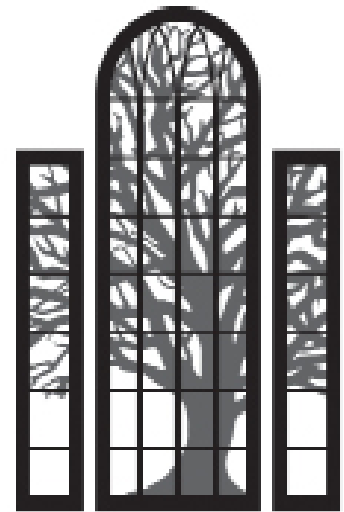
Of course, these two actions are just the beginning. There are plenty of questions unanswered. There is a lot of process and timing as of yet undetermined. However, we are on our way. We are on our way to living into being the church God is calling us to be now and for the future. Of course, if it isn't broken we won't be fixing it. We are getting lots of things right. But if God is calling us to better stewardship, to greater sustainability of ministries, to let go or to start something new, we will be listening.

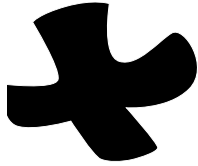

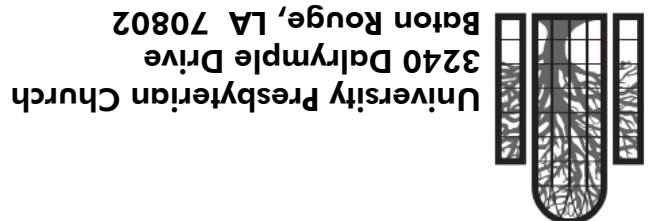
