Every time I go to Tallahassee where I grew up, I go by the little white duplex on Miccosukee Drive. It's where I lived from the age of 5 until I was 16. I go because I like to trace my fingers over my initials carved in the retaining wall out front, to see if the windows in my old bedroom are the same jalousied type, and in the spring I check to see if the azaleas are blooming like they always have. As a matter of fact, if I can, I drive or walk around the whole neighborhood. It's something of a touchpoint, a measuring stick. So much of it seems the same.

Of course things are different in Tallahassee, just like they are in Baton Rouge. But to me, even though there's now an apartment building in the old vacant lot next door and the pine trees my brother helped plant in the front yard of the elementary school across the street somewhere around 1966 are HUGE, there will always be something about Tallahassee that is the same.

When I visit the church I grew up in things are, likewise, both the same and different. The youth group still sits upstairs in the balcony, bulletins wafting down occasionally. The guy who was in college when I was a child still records the service. The music is still beautiful. The prayers of the people are still peppered with both personal trials and social problems. I recently saw the pastor among the crowd at a demonstration on the Florida capitol steps on ABC news, just like the old civil rights days. But, the choir is no longer up front. The liturgy is much more Episcopalian than I remember. And the pew that I always expect to find empty, waiting for me to show up and sit there with my grandfather, has long ago been "taken over" by another family. I love visiting worship and seeing all of the relationships lived out between people I used to know and all those new folks!

I have cultivated a joy in finding the place different and yet the same. Perhaps you have had or have similar feelings when you come to UPC? Things are different and will continue to change if we are growing and deepening and responding. Things will remain the same because the gospel isn't and won't ever be outdated. As Elizabeth Newman puts it in her book Untamed Hospitality: Welcoming God and Other Strangers, there is a difference between "telling a story differently and telling a different story."

We still have the "Old, Old Story," but it gets told in new ways across the centuries but also throughout a single lifetime and throughout the lifetime of a single congregation. How amazing that the story stands up, stands up to the test of time without getting rusty, that is, in a way, unless we do.

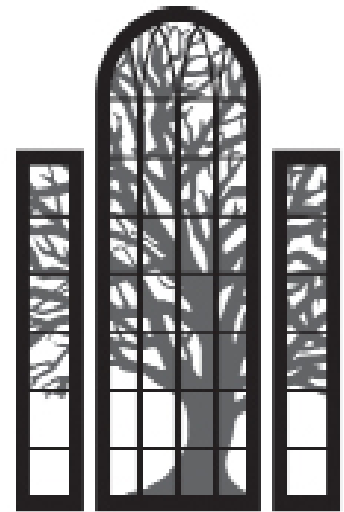

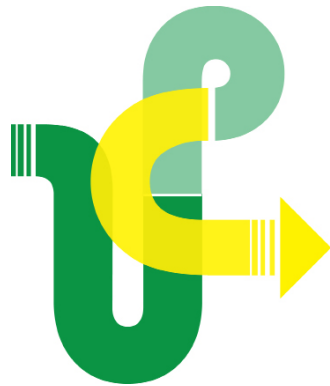

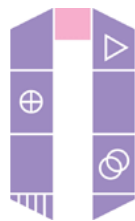

The Shower of Stoles Project is an extraordinary collection of over one thousand liturgical stoles and other sacred items representing the lives of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) people of faith. These religious leaders have served in over thirty denominations and faith traditions and come from six countries on three continents.

This collection celebrates the gifts of LGBT persons who serve God in countless ways, while also lifting up those who have been excluded from service because of their sexual orientation or gender identity. The Project bears witness to the huge loss of leadership that the Church has brought upon itself because of its own unjust policies. The collection tours constantly around the country, being exhibited in local congregations, universities and seminaries, and regional and national denominational gatherings.

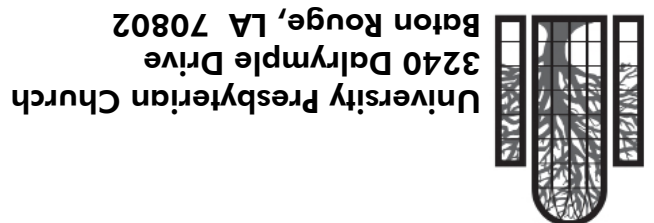
