First of all, thank you so much for your willing and prompt responses to the UPC Moving Forward survey! As of the deadline on May 21, we have received 122 responses, close to double the typical survey response! This means that we have lots of initial information that will help our decision process for moving forward truly reflect the experiences, hopes, and dreams of our congregation. So, you might be wondering, what's next?

Members of the Session are in the process of pulling together the raw Survey Monkey data in order that it might be readily available for members of the congregation to read. You will receive an email containing an Excel document that will have all the raw data (minus names) sometime very soon. It will be a very large document! If you need assistance in reading this document, which will require some facility with Excel, you can contact, Doug Walker. In addition, a printed copy of the full document will be made available in the church library. We do ask that you not remove this printed copy from the library. The Session is also engaging assistance from qualitative data analysis expert, Dr. Pam Monroe, who will provide analysis from a non-biased position of the data received. Her work will be to unearth themes and summaries to inform our decision making. Once the Session has received her report, we will explore the best ways to engage the whole congregation in the process of decision making in regards to our action steps as we move forward.

This is an exciting time with lots of careful thought and energy going into the process, but, of course, it isn't perfect. Please feel free to express any concerns you might have about it, but also remember that everyone has the best interests of UPC at heart! The Holy Spirit is moving in our midst, and that's always an adventure – filled with joy and surprise! Please know that the Session realizes that, while many are excited by the directions that Moving Forward may take, for others it feels uncomfortable and even a bit scary. Let's continue to listen to each other and for the Spirit's call and to speak both our experience and hopes in love!

As one of our own always says to us, "Thank God for you!"



THIS SUMMER IN HOSPITALITY HALL

Summer heat and a new season for hurricane watching is slowing down the number of volunteers coming to stay in Hospitably Hall. We have one group in June and two in July.

In June, the group from Charleston, IL, returns for their second week of work in Baton Rouge. There will be a community dinner for them on June 7 at 6:30 p.m. Also in June we have a group of 30 youth and adults coming through Baton Rouge on their way to Florida. This youth group contacted us and asked to spend one night! They will come in late and leave early. We are glad to have the space to offer them.

In July we have a group coming for the first time from Omaha, NE! We have repeatedly warned them of the heat and they say they are up for it! There will be a Community Dinner for them on July 12 at 6:30 p.m. Then a group comes from First Presbyterian in Burlington, NC, the next week. They will be here for a shorter work week and have been coming to help in south Louisiana since Katrina. This is their first time in Baton Rouge.

Mary Mikell recently compiled some numbers on HH. Since opening in January of 2017, we have had 31 groups at HH (many of those were returning groups). We have accommodated more than 200 individuals from 19 states. 177 projects have been completed (about 60 of these were homes that needed to be gutted & rebuilt.). Wow! What a wonderful set of numbers!

LOVE AND WATER

What binds UPC in Baton Rouge, USA, and Iglesia Getsemani in San Jose de los Ramos, Cuba, together? Of course their Christian beliefs and their deep friendships, but especially their access to agua limpia, clean water. Before 2013 when a team from UPC installed a Living Waters of the World water system at our long-time partner church, clean water was not readily available. Now, clean water is available to townspeople, church members, persons referred by their doctors, and others. Health and hygiene have been significantly improved. George Strain tells the story of one woman, ill, home-bound, and confined to bed, who recovered after the water became available

For the past five years, the system operator was Susana, educated as a mechanical engineer but unable to find a job in her field in her small town. The LWW team from UPC trained her as an operator. Three to four mornings a week, Susana came in to treat the water, returning in the afternoon to dispense it.

Now Susana has felt a call to the ministry and has been accepted to the seminary in Matanzas. As a seminary requirement, she must spend six months or more in a church different from her home church, and she has started work at the Presbyterian Church in Sabanilla. Before she left San Jose, however, she had trained three other members of that church to assume her duties. When George met with them, he found them well-trained and understanding of all the position calls for.

By a "small world" coincidence, the US partner church to the Sabanilla church is First Presbyterian in Lafayette. A group there is hoping to raise funds to install a LWW water system in Sabanilla.

May the friendships and the blessings continue and the love rain down like water.

This mission is accomplished by providing resources through benevolences and hands on assistance to selected community organizations. The Interfaith Federation of Baton Rouge

The mission of The Interfaith Federation of Baton Rouge is to "to cultivate interfaith understanding and cooperation to reduce human suffering in Greater Baton Rouge." One of their programs is The Holy Grill, which provides hot, nutritious lunches prepared at the Interfaith Federation office and transported to Cadillac St. Park. In addition to an annual donation of \$3,000, M&P provides servers at The Holy Grill during a week in June. This year we will be serving lunch during the week of June 11 – 15. A sign-up list will be available in the Welcome Center on Sundays May 27 and June 10. Please join us. This is a limited time commitment to help support Baton Rouge families in need and to fulfill our commitment for collaboration with the Interfaith Federation of Baton Rouge. Domestic Violence Program - IRIS

The IRIS Domestic Violence Center provides housing and comprehensive services to survivors of intimate partner violence and their children. Because the building was purchased over 30 years ago and is in desperate need of repairs, renovations, and mini renovation projects, the Center has reached out to the public to sponsor one of the resident bedrooms or public spaces. The Adopt-A-Room Program allows the Center to help create a warm and welcoming first impression for the women and their children as they begin the road to self-sufficiency. There are 22 bedrooms, 4 common areas, 5 bathrooms, and offices that all need tender loving care. University Presbyterian Church was one of two kickoff sponsors of this program by using our annual benevolence contribution of \$1,000 to purchase dressers for all the bedrooms

Cuban Presbytery Mission

Four UPC members (Carl Motsenbocker, Edward Peterson, George Strain, and Frances Sullivan-Gonzalez) recently visited our partner church in Cuba, Getsemaní Iglesia (church) in San José de los Ramos, as well as several other familiar locations. For the first time we met the church's new Pastora. Zorky Crespo (also pastor to two other churches) and their assigned Candidato al Pastorado, Anier González. Also new is their Living Waters treatment system operator, Yeni Lezcano, as the previous operator, Susana, has entered the seminary. We renewed our friendship with our frequent translator, Melissa Rodriguez. We were warmly received at San José as well as at our other stops. The group conveyed budgeted funds (\$780.00) from the UPC Mission & Peacemaking Committee in support of the San José church's operation as well as a host of other gifts: bottles of vitamins and other personal health items, a baseball glove, water filters, two suitcases of fabric, a case of Spanish Bible study books, speakers for the church's laptop, and letters and cards. We also met with members of San José's mission church in Mangito. We brought back a list of congregation members for whom our prayers are requested, many of whom we visited. They are listed below. It is our hope - and the request of our partners - to make annual return visits.

In addition to visiting San José, we made stops at Dora Arce Valentín church in Varadero, Matanzas Central church and the Seminario Evangélico de Teología in Matanzas, the Consejo de Iglesias de Cuba (Cuban Council of Churches) in Havana (and their Executive Secretary Dopico), and El Retiro, a Christian retreat and sustainable agriculture center between Varadero and San José that has a full-scale biogas generating facility. We had many adventures of a mostly humorous nature and experienced continued warm friendship and appreciation. We hope to have a fellowship event soon to present pictures of our trip and details of our 25+ year mission with our partner church in San José.
