A good summer read brings back childhood memories of flashlight deep under the bed covers and staying up till my eyes were bleary to finish my current book. This summer I'm inviting you to join me in taking the summer read to new.....well....depths.

This spring I read a book that has changed my thinking. Reading it and engaging in conversation and meditation around what it says has changed how I see. The book is Richard Rohr's The Universal Christ. The conversation and meditation around it began in New Mexico at a conference by the same name but has continued since I've returned as I've read scripture to prepare sermons, been in conversation with you, and engaged in my own practice of prayer.

This summer I'm going to reread The Universal Christ, and I'd like to invite you to join me in reading, conversation, and contemplation around it. What I'm imagining is a time to gather twice per month – beginning in June – for an hour or so each time. The gathering will be centered around specific questions from the chapter(s) we've read as well as time for silent and shared reflection. Reading the book will be essential, although reading it in small “bites” rather than devouring it is encouraged.

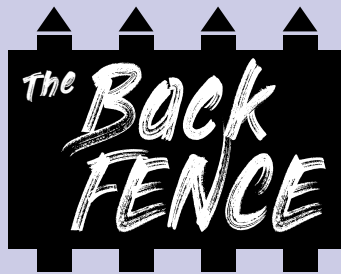

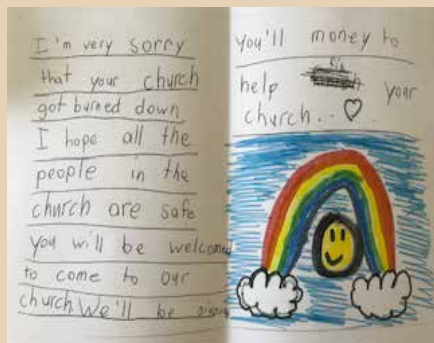

Paying it Forward

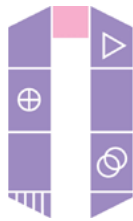

The Shower of Stoles Project is an extraordinary collection of liturgical stoles and other sacred items representing the lives of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) people of faith. These religious leaders have served in over thirty denominations and faith traditions and come from six countries on three continents.

This collection celebrates the gifts of LGBT persons who serve God in countless ways while also lifting up those who have been excluded from service because of their sexual orientation or gender identity. The Project bears witness to the huge loss of leadership that the Church has brought upon itself because of its own unjust policies. The collection tours constantly around the country, being exhibited in local congregations, universities and seminaries, and regional and national denominational gatherings. This year a selection of the stoles will be featured at the UPC table at Pride Fest on June 15.

IRIS Update

Room 3 at the Iris Domestic Violence Center of Baton Rouge is clean, safe, and beautiful, thanks to the financial support of UPC and the expertise, financial support and physical labor of UPC members. Many thanks to all who supported this important project!

Iris kicked off an Adopt a Room project in early 2018, starting the campaign by purchasing durable chests of drawers using funds from UPC's Mission & Peacemaking Committee from late 2017. When they reached out to us, UPC chose to adopt one of the single rooms. More than a little TLC was needed for the room, which had an old, stained carpet, electrical outlets that did not work, dark, scuffed paint, and a ceiling that was falling in and partially supported by plywood.

Much of the reconstruction work was planned and completed by Doug Walker and Melanie Driscoll, including pulling up carpet, installing wood floor, baseboards, shoe molding and a threshold, replacing the ceiling with new ceiling tiles, repairing walls, and replacing the light switch and electrical outlets.

Karen Foote and Mike Olinde led the painting crew, selecting the a neutral off white color for three walls and a soft blue for an accent wall. Painters included Karen Foote, Mike Olinde, Pat Ho, Pat Wright, Lorinda Sealey, and Melanie Driscoll.

Amybeth and Wes Mainord and Bizza Britton led the decorating team. They purchased a comforter, sheets, pillowcases, pillows, a lamp, and wall decorations. They got a donation of a trundle bed to allow a parent and child to sleep together, or a parent with more than one child to use the room comfortably. Ed Green and Griffin Campbell helped move and assemble the trundle bed, and Melanie helped to make the bed and decorate the room.

Staff and residents at Iris were very excited about the room throughout the process. They exclaimed over the beautiful gray floor, were in awe of the new ceiling, and appreciated Doug's helpfulness in replacing other light bulbs, identifying breakers to various parts of the building, and otherwise offering good advice.

Many hours of work and a lot of love went into Room 3. A side benefit of the project was a greater awareness among our UPC community of the needs at Iris. Several UPC members made other donations of clothing, toys, and other goods to the shelter. Many thanks for the generosity of spirit and kindness that led so many to contribute goods, money, time and talent to create a safe, beautiful space for at risk women and children in Baton Rouge.

Volunteer at Holy Grill

The mission of The Interfaith Federation of Baton Rouge is to "to cultivate interfaith understanding and cooperation to reduce human suffering in Greater Baton Rouge." One of their programs is The Holy Grill, which provides hot, nutritious lunches prepared at the Interfaith Federation office and transported to Cadillac St. Park. In addition to an annual donation of \$3,000, UPC provides servers at The Holy Grill during one week in June. **This year we will be serving lunch during the week of June 10 - 14. In addition, we are looking for a volunteer or two to help stock shelves at the Interfaith Federation office on Tuesday, June 11.** A sign-up list will be available in the Welcome Center on Sundays until June 9. Please join us. This activity will take no more than one to one and a half hours, including travel to and from the site and serving lunch. This is a limited time commitment to help support Baton Rouge families in need and to fulfill our commitment for collaboration with the Interfaith Federation of Baton Rouge. Please sign up to help on one day during the week of June 10-14.
