One day this summer I had lunch with one of you. I drove. When we got back to your house, you apologized a bit for the weedy vines that were growing over your living room window. Of course, there was absolutely no judgment on my part. Heavens, in the "summer of the concussion" (who am I kidding, ANY time of year of ANY year) I can throw no stones about things that we intend to do but that can't seem to make it to the top of our lists.

I've thought about that little encounter more than once since that day.

I've thought about how easy it is to let things get out of control and yet how sometimes there are gifts in the things that are...out of control, that is. For example, I imagine that my lunch partner's living room was nice and shady this summer.

I've thought about how timing is everything. Sometimes things just need to get a little unruly before we know that we need to, or how to, trim back. Of course I'm talking about more than weedy vines in our yards. Together we've been "reshaping" our life together with changes in the role of deacons and with potential organizational changes on the horizon. I've been reshaping some of my work and life patterns due to my "unruly" brain after the concussion; some of it is stuff I've needed to do for a long time but have been forced to follow thru on now. That kind of thing ever happen to you?

I've thought about the windows through which we see ourselves, each other, and the world. How sometimes they get covered up and our vision occluded by stuff...unnecessary, sometimes unhelpful, invasive "weeds." Those "weeds" can be old unexamined patterns, unrealistic expectations, egoistic preoccupations, or fears.

And I've thought about the window we look through together each Sunday. About the weeds that sometimes have their way with the azaleas and about the beautiful tree that so shapes our sense of place. But mostly I've thought of the fern that grows on the tree. You know it's called a "resurrection fern," right? It, like us sometimes, dries up and gets brittle, but then with the rain, like God's presence poured out once again, it comes back to life.

I don't know what might be out of control in your life. I don't know all that might be a bit "unruly" for you right now. I don't know what "weeds" might be blocking or changing or clouding your vision. I do see plenty that has "run amuck" in the world. And I do know that like the resurrection fern outside our window that may be dried up right now, it won't be that way forever. God is working on it and we will see it green up again one Sunday soon.

PARTNERSHIP SCHOOL TAKES OFF INTO THE 21ST CENTURY

Amazing New Facility for Park Elementary

Park Elementary, UPC's partner school, kicks off the new school year in a state-of-the-art facility. Its neighborhood students now have a physical setting that is unmatched in EBR, with Park's two story 75,000 sq. ft facility that is just around the block from the old school. Park Elementary was established in 1955, and many community leaders have attended Park over the years. Park Elementary is now at 2680 Bogan Walk, and its School Attendance Zone is generally the area from the Mississippi River to North Acadian Thruway and from Florida Blvd. to Choctaw.

The 21st century building has been described as a counterpart to the new Lee High school in design. There is a school within a school feeling as each grade has a cluster of three classrooms centered on a shared learning space. The facility also includes two science rooms, as well as art, music, dance, and workout rooms. A library and media center and multi-purpose area with a large stage complete the building. The outside areas include the latest in play structures and a sound garden of chimes for the students to play and an outdoor learning space.

The new Park construction was funded by the EBR voters when they passed a one cent sales tax renewal for public school construction in 2008. Although in 2017 the superintendent of schools proposed to close Park rather than rebuild, strong support from the neighboring community and area faith leaders to stay with the original goal of the 2008 tax renewal which included a new Park prevailed. At the recent ribbon-cutting ceremony, Superintendent Warren Drake warmly thanked those responsible for keeping Park on the rebuild agenda.

University Presbyterian has long been engaged in the East Baton Rouge Parish Schools' Volunteers in Public Schools (VIPS), and for the last 10 years has been a VIPS partner with Park Elementary. We support Park by being Reading Friends, volunteering at Park events like Book Fair, Fall Fest and cleanups, collecting various food labels (i.e. Community Coffee and Box Tops for Education) which the school turns in for funds, donating school supplies, and providing an annual designated benevolence to support the school's activities. Park Elementary welcomes UPC to important school events, such as end of year celebrations, as well as school milestones like the recent groundbreaking and ribbon cutting celebrations for the new Park Elementary facility. If you want to get involved in public education in EBR, please join UPC's on the ground work with Park Elementary.
