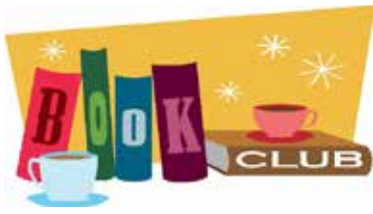
Thank you for the beautiful ways you are building beloved community in this time of physical separation!

Day School

UPC Day School Now Open

With everyone's health and safety at the forefront, the UPC Day School opened its doors on June 15. There are new rules, new hours and new procedures, but it's still a welcoming place that provides a needed service for our community. The first week went well, according to Terry Iyasere, the director, with an average of 37 children each day. That number will go up as families get back from vacations. Seventeen of the 28 employees are back this summer

Changes at the Day School include the following:

- The hours are shorter. The Day School is now open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The shorter hours allow the staff to do the required cleaning and disinfecting as per the CDC regulations.
- The children are dropped off and picked up via a drive-thru lane. Parents are not allowed to enter the facility.
- Staff check the children's temperatures while they are still in the car when they arrive and two hours after. Their temperature must be below 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit to remain at school. Staff members' temperatures also are checked when they come to work.
- Staff wear masks, a clean one each day. The children two and younger do not wear masks (they are a choking hazard for children under 2). Older children may wear masks if their parents want them to, but they are not required.
- The children are socially distanced by groups. Each group remains together for snack, lunch, playtime and naptime. Groups are separated and do not interact with other groups during the day.
- If a child were to get sick at school, they are isolated, and the parents are called to come get them. If they are found to have COVID-19, this is reported to the Louisiana Department of Health to proceed with the contact tracing.
- Intensified cleaning and disinfecting are done every hour for surfaces, bathrooms and objects that are frequently touched.
- Heathy hand hygiene by the children and staff are done often throughout the day.

We are grateful for the support of the Session, whose approval was required for this reopening. We also are grateful to the Louisiana Department of Education, which has provided training, funds, and supplies for reopening.

Mission & Peacemaking

UPC Immigrants in Detention Pen Pal Partnership

The UPC Immigrants in Detention Pen Pal Partnership was launched two weeks ago in collaboration with Acadiana Advocates for Immigrants in Detention (Acadiana AID). Since early 2019, the majority of immigrants crossing the southern US border in search of asylum have been detained and imprisoned. Louisiana detention centers and parish jails house close to 7,000 detainees. They are held indefinitely, often in windowless cells or huge dormitories. One way to express our concern and let them know they are not forgotten is by corresponding with them. Thirteen UPC members responded to a call to show hospitality by writing to detainees who have expressed interest in receiving letters.

Acadiana AID, a grass roots organization offering support to detainees, provided names and addresses of immigrants in detention centers across the state, which they obtain through the Freedom of Information Act. No legal assistance will be offered to detainees and any such requests will be forwarded to Acadiana AID to direct them to the appropriate resources. Following a brief orientation about Acadiana AID and their letter writing program, with some guidance about appropriate messaging, UPC participants were assigned detainee pen pals from Cameroon, Cuba, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, and Nigeria. Our intent is to send letters of encouragement to lift their spirits, offer feelings of hope, and provide a sense of community. TBR House Meeting Initiative

In May, Together Louisiana (of which Together Baton Rouge is a part) brought together more than 1,200 leaders of congregations and citizens organizations across the state, across the lines of race, geography and political affiliation, to commit to work together to improve our state and local community. The premise of the meeting was that the crisis brought on by the COVID pandemic presented an opportunity to "Reimagine Louisiana" as the kind of community our faith and democratic traditions call us to create.

The event launched a campaign called "10,000 CONVERSATIONS," has three goals:

- 1) to fight isolation in a time of social distancing
- 2) to understand first-hand the issues affecting people in our communities as the economic impact of COVID-19 deepens
- 3) to build a base of community sufficiently broad and diverse to bring about change that will strengthen our state and local areas.

Since that time, racial unrest and the call for police reform has further energized many congregations to include race relations in the discussions. Along with many congregations which make up Together Baton Rouge, UPC will partner with an African American congregation in a series of house meetings; the goal of which is to deepen our relationship, and discover ways in which we can move ahead towards common goals of racial equity, law enforcement reform, and the creation of a healthy community.

These partnered house meetings will take place in late summer and early Fall. If you are interested in serving on a leadership team for the house meetings, please contact Patti or Betsy.

Committee Changes Name from Christian Education to Faith Formation

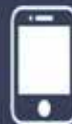

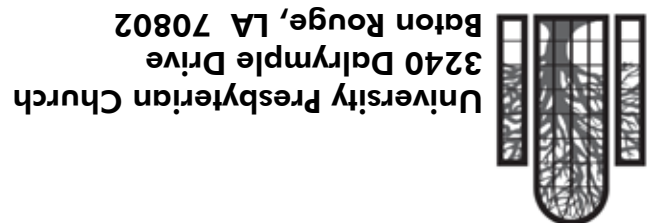
