

Day School

The UPC Day School is “standing on a precipice,” to echo what Pastor Patti Snyder said in her October 25th sermon about University Presbyterian Church. 2021 will be a year to rebuild and get back to our goal of 95% capacity. Enrollment is currently at 51%, although a few more parents may start bringing their children yet this session. Many parents are not returning because they are still working from home, and some have grandparents serving as child care providers during the pandemic.

Once there is a vaccine, our economy will begin to surge back and there will be increasing demand for child care. Along with that, there will be demand for good child care providers. Due to the pandemic, we lost good staff members because some decided they did not want to work in a risky environment, one retired, and some went to higher-paying jobs.

Not only is the shortage of day care teachers a problem for us, but it's a problem for all day care centers in Louisiana and nationwide. The pandemic has exposed the low salaries and meager benefits for these essential workers. Our director, Terry Iyasere, is participating in the Louisiana Department of Education's Louisiana Early Leaders Academy, an 11-month learning and development program, with 30 other day care center directors. Day care worker salaries is one of the issues they will be addressing.


Session Highlights

The Session continues to meet via zoom to attend to the business of the church. At our stated meeting on October 25 we had the pleasure of examining new deacon Kathy Rossman, who will be ordained and installed during worship soon.


Because the Session has approved a **new set of guidelines for limited in-person uses of church facilities**, those guidelines will be posted on the church website soon and application forms will be available for groups to fill out. Briefly, the procedure will be

1. Get the form from Caralyn.
2. Check with Caralyn that the date and time requested is available.
3. Get approval from the appropriate committee, or if there isn't a committee related to the request, run the request by one of the pastors.
4. The Session will vote on the request. We will hold an extra called meeting on the second Sunday of each month, if needed, to approve requests for such gatherings once they come to us from a committee or pastor.

Note that in-person meetings at church can only happen while Louisiana is in Phase 3 plus 2 weeks. If we go back to phase 2 or 1, they will be suspended.

Zoom/Video Meeting Etiquette

Tips and best practices for online video conference meetings

Think of a Zoom Meeting as a face-to-face meeting and conduct yourself as you would if you were all present in the same room. In addition there are some additional useful tips below to observe to help ensure the meeting goes smoothly for all involved:

- **Light your face.** Part of the benefit of video conferencing is being able to see familiar faces and read nonverbal cues when necessary. If possible, take video calls from a well-lit room or position yourself facing a light source like a window. Don't sit with a light source behind you, because you essentially just become a silhouette.
- **Mute yourself.** Some Zoom moderators might do this for you, but it's a good policy to simply mute yourself as soon as you log on. You never really need to have your mic on unless you're speaking. And be sure to mute if you're moving around, eating, typing, or answering a call on your phone.
- **Turn off your video when applicable.** If you need to get up and leave for any reason that could be distracting to a group (bio break, snack, whatever), simply turn off your video.
- **Use virtual backgrounds.** If you don't feel like showing your lack of decoration skills or messy piles of stuff, simply use a virtual background. Go to settings, Virtual Backgrounds, and choose one. Being in outer space might be better than forcing people to stare at your laundry that needs folding.
- **Be polite.** With meeting attendee numbers of more than 6-8, Zoom recommends using the "raise a hand" feature or chat box to let it be known you have something to say or a question, assuming chat is being monitored. Otherwise, unmute, wait for a pause, and bring up your thought. Similar to conference calls, there will be times when you and someone else speak at the same time. Just be patient and realize this is part of the new norm.




