## **Session Notes**

At the September stated meeting the ruling elders took up the question of when we will worship and meet in person again. Following the recommendation of the COVID Safety Task Force, they voted as follows:

We will consider that in-person indoor worship and indoor gatherings are "safe enough" when:

 LDH Region 2 test positivity rate (average over 14 days) reaches 7% or less.

**AND** 

• LDH Region 2 number of new cases (average over 14 days) is 115 or less.

Upon reaching these metrics, as reported on the official state website, session approves the building opening. Co-pastors with input from other staff are empowered to determine the precise date of return to in-person indoor worship/gatherings as soon thereafter as they determine it feasible.

In other news the following church officers are rotating off: Drew Patty, who has been serving as both church treasurer and chair of the Stewardship and Finance Committee, will be replaced by Cordell Haymon (Chair of S & F) and Edward Peterson (Treasurer). Jerry Trahan has agreed to serve as Clerk of Session, replacing Jeff Perry. Since the church treasurer and clerk are both trustees of the church, these positions will rotate as well.

## **Cuba and Syringes**

Although Cuba was relatively unaffected by COVID-19 early in the pandemic, the island nation has been rocked in the last six months by great numbers of infections and deaths. Over 70 people die daily, with 7,000 to 9,000 new cases each day, including 1,500 - 2,000 children. However, Cuba's biomedical capacity is impressive, despite the enormous constraints of the US embargo of the past 59 years. Cuba has actually developed three COVID vaccines: Abdala, Soberana 1, and Soberana 2, which require 3 shots per person. Cuba is the only Caribbean or South American country to develop their own vaccine. Their plan is to have 90% of the entire population vaccinated by November 15th. They are also exporting the vaccines to other third world countries.

So, Cuba has vaccines but needs syringes and has been unable to obtain them because of the US embargo. UPC partnered with Westminster Presbyterian Church in Minneapolis and other churches that are a part of the Living Waters for the World Cuba Network to raise funds to purchase syringes (at 3 cents each) through the Global Health Partners and ship them to Cuba. Leveraging the donations with a \$10,000 match grant, a total of 641,967 syringes were sent!

In addition, the Cuba Partners Network of the PC(USA) (UPC is a member) raised funds in support of the Presbyterian Reformed Church of Cuba; a part of those funds were used to purchase sufficient staples that are in desperately short supply to fill a shipping container. Included were 40,000 pounds of rice, beans, coffee, and 28,000 syringes. The container was awaiting shipment out of the Port of New Orleans when Hurricane Ida struck, but will soon depart. It is an enormous joy to be able to support our Cuban partners and friends in their great time of need.

## **Seeking Support**

Afghan refugees will be coming into Baton Rouge to be resettled by Catholic Charities. More ways to help will be forthcoming from the folks on Mission and Peacemaking Committee, but a big need is for leads on apartments to house these families. If anyone can help finding apartments and working with landlords, it will be of great service. The families will not meet some typical rental criteria (ex. 3 months work history).
