Rather than make it to a lot of museums or up a lot of mountains, we did a lot of rocking, walking/jiggling, and trying to be helpful - either directly with the baby, or by walking the dog, unloading the dishwasher, going to the store, or doing the laundry. It turns out, when folks enter a new stage of life (as my brother and sister-in-law have), a lot is up in the air, and stepping in to offer a hand with almost anything is really a big help. When big changes come, every little bit helps.

The same feels true to be for UPC at the moment. We have entered a new stage, and a lot is up in the air (and will continue to be for a little while). There are a lot of ways you can step in and offer a hand if you're able to do so:

- volunteer to be a second pair of hands in the nursery on Sunday
- sign up to help with kids or youth on Sunday mornings next year
- offer to be part of the team that welcomes visitors
- deliver flowers or meals to brighten peoples' day
- help us continue connecting to our mission partners, or offer new opportunities to serve our city
- join efforts to support our Day School
- learn how we do the live stream so worship can be shared outside our walls

... or anything else that comes to mind, because when changes come, every little bit helps. If you wondered when would be a good time to step in, I promise you it is now.

What the Session and I ask of all of you - near or far - is that you keep UPC in your prayers in this transition time. Hold this community in your mind's eye, and in your heart, and ask:

- that we listen for the Spirit's rustling, and that we be willing to heed God's nudges
- that we find the right balance of patience and continuity with attempts to try new things and getting carried away
- that we be guided by love and hope and faith as we step into the future we will cocreate with God
- or anything else that comes to mind.

We're praying some of these same prayers for Fletcher and his parents too. It's a way we can show our love and care, but it's also a way to stay connected while we are far away. That connection is part of what will draw us back and move us to change the diapers and clean the dishes and play the games, which is another part of how we show our love and care. Thoughts, prayers, and action - they're all related. And, when big changes come, we are grateful for all of them.



Louisiana Organization for Refugees and Immigrants (LORI)

Due to an increasing number of refugees and immigrants calling Louisiana home, an attempt to assist these newcomers throughout the various stages of integration in our community and with the ultimate goal of promoting self-reliance, the Louisiana Organization for Refugees and Immigrants (LORI) was founded. LORI currently represents a coalition of immigrants and refugees now living in Louisiana from over 25 countries. LORI partners with federal, state and local agencies in pursuit of its goals. The Mission and Peacemaking committee is pleased to report our continuing support for this organization, which recently celebrated its 5-year anniversary.

The programs and services offered by LORI to fulfill its mission fall under the following broad categories:

- a. Immigration Specific Legal Representation and Resources such as assistance with immigration applications, Know Your Rights and Responsibilities sessions, and citizenship classes.
- b. Civic Engagement and Policy Advocacy, including information about official immigration policies, and advocacy issues and actions.
- c. Community Outreach and Cultural Events to engage refugee and immigrant families socially, and to educate the public by sharing their stories. (For example the Women's Wing and World Refugee Day, scheduled for June 24, 2023.)
- d. Education and Access to Services includes but is not limited to leadership development, youth empowerment programs, financial literacy sessions, ESL classes, partnerships with agencies such as Red Cross, FEMA, EBR Parish Housing Authority.

LORI is funded through grants and contributions from individuals, community organizations and religious institutions like ours. We look forward to lending our continued support and encourage you to do the same. LORI is always in need of household items to help newly arrived families get settled. Another challenge facing LORI is transportation; many immigrants have difficulty accessing LORI's services, such as ESL and citizenship classes, due to lack of transportation. If you have household items to donate or if you would like to assist with transportation, you may reach out to Lorinda Sealey (see church directory for contact information) or contact LORI directly at https://www.mylori.org/

Join Paterson's Posse at 9 a.m. for the 2023 Baton Rouge Team Hope Walk at Highland Road Park, a fund-raising event for the Huntington's Disease Society of America. The "posse," made up of UPC members and friends, is named after the family of Karen Paterson, who lost her husband and both daughters to Huntington's disease. The posse was formed in 2009 as a way to show support for Karen and her family and do something to help bring an end to this devastating, yet little-known, disease - and you can always join in! UPC members helped organize the first Louisiana Team Hope Walk in 2009. Since then, these walk events have been held in other parts of the state to coincide with the nationwide effort. All proceeds from the walks go to research and family support efforts of the HDSA. The goal for this year's Baton Rouge event is \$17,150.

Registration begins at 9 a.m. at the park's main shelter, and the half-mile walk around the park, which may be repeated for a longer option, starts at 10 a.m. The cost is \$30 for adults and \$15 for children, although any amount will be accepted as a donation.
