

Alison Infante Zamora

The Rev. Alison Infante Zamora currently serves as moderator of the Synod of the Presbytery of Matanzas (IPRC). His ministry experience includes various ecclesial and ecumenical responsibilities, such as chairing the IPRC's Social Policy Study Commission and serving as moderator of the IPRC. In his work, Alison emphasizes the social

pastoral ministry as a way of proclaiming the Gospel. Under this premise, for example, the Azabache project, an antiracism and community empowerment project, exists. The church also provides cultural spaces hosting tertulias — social and conversational gatherings — and an exhibition hall for plastic art works, through which values such as respect, dialogue and aesthetic education are affirmed, especially in young artists from the community.

Fast Facts

- The literacy rate in Cuba is 99.8%, which is one of the highest in the world.
- Cuba is the largest Island in the Caribbean.
- One of the highest patient-to-doctor ratios can be found in Cuba.
- Cuba is home to the smallest bird in the world.

Partners

The PC(USA) has a partnership with the Presbyterian-Reformed Church in Cuba (PRCC) and the Evangelical Theological Seminary.

- In the Synod of the Presbyterian-Reformed Church in Cuba (PRCC) in 2010, there
 were over 10,000 members in 32 "organized churches" in three presbyteries:
 Center, Matanzas and Havana. There are also about 20 "dependent churches,"
 missions and house churches. For historical reasons, all of these are located in the
 central part of the nation.
- Through the Evangelical Theological Seminary in Matanzas, students receive
 preparation for ministry. Lay leaders receive training through programs around
 the island. There are many PC(USA) congregation and presbytery partnerships
 with Cuban churches and presbyteries.
- The PRCC, together with the Episcopal Church in Cuba and others, operates the
 Evangelical Theological Seminary, which was founded as a Presbyterian institution
 at Cárdenas in 1920 and relocated to Matanzas when the sponsorship became
 ecumenical in 1946. The PRCC is one of the founding members of the Cuban
 Council of Churches, whose immediate past-president is a Presbyterian layman.
