On the first Sunday of Lent, I read the following prayer as our benediction to send us out on our 40-day journey with Jesus with these journeying words written by the Trappist monk and theologian, Thomas Merton:

My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road, though I may know nothing about it. Therefore will I trust you always though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for you are ever with me, and you will never leave me to face my perils alone.

Not quite halfway through Lent now, we continue our journey toward Jerusalem with Jesus. If you did not commit to any particular practice of attention toward God this season (giving something up, taking something on, prayer or devotional time, etc.) there is nothing that says you can't start now. And if you did say you would do something but haven't really kept up with it, try again - there's no shame in starting over.

And that last four lines of the prayer? They're beautiful but, while I believe them, I'm not sure I always live up to them. So, let's just call it aspirational - fake it 'til you make it, or do your best and you'll get better - the same as Lenten disciplines. They all take practice. Practice may not actually make perfect in this case, but God doesn't care about perfect. God cares about you.

Mission & Peacemaking

Hello UPC! It's your Mission and Peacemaking committee, checking in on goals and plans for 2024. Last year, some things we were grateful for included work within long-standing partnerships – like continuing UPC's decades-long commitment with our partner church in Cuba, helping them serve their community by ensuring clean water, repairing the essential pastoral tool of a functioning church vehicle, and supporting their ability to serve meals for vulnerable seniors. We were also grateful for new initiatives, like freeing many of our neighbors in Louisiana from thousands of dollars in medical debt, through our donation drive for RIP Medical Debt. We are glad of how this and other work is helping us to live in to our commitments as a Matthew 25 church, to eradicate systemic poverty, and dismantle structural racism. What will we – all of us – discern and do this year?

First off – come talk about it! There are a couple of important conversations coming up where your presence and your voice are essential. Within our UPC community, please come join the Churchwide Conversation on March 3rd where we will talk about our vision for the future at UPC. Ramadan

Ramadan is an annual celebration in Islam of the revelation of the Qu'ran to the Prophet Muhammad. As with Easter it is not a fixed date but rather moves around according to the moon. (Easter is the first Sunday after the full Moon that occurs on or after the spring equinox. If the full Moon falls on a Sunday then Easter is the next Sunday. This is why you just look it up. Ramadan takes place in the ninth month of the Islamic calendar after the first crescent moon of the month appears.) This year Ramadan begins on March 10th and continues through April 9th.

Most families observe Ramadan with fasting, prayer, and charitable deeds. Children, sick people, the elderly, and pregnant women are allowed to skip fasting. Fasting Muslims don't eat or drink between sunrise and sunset during Ramadan, so most families get up early to enjoy a pre-dawn meal (suhoor) and then gather again once the sun is down for a large meal (iftar). Fasting is meant to remind Muslims of people who don't have enough to eat and to spur them toward doing good deeds. The end of Ramadan is called Eid-al-Fitr (or just Eid - said like "Eed" - April 10th this year); the "Festival of Breaking the Fast." People often give children sweets and enjoy a big celebration. It is appropriate to say "Eid Mubarak" (Blessed Eid) to any of your friends or colleagues who celebrate that day.
