

Whether you are here or away, we want to make sure you are aware of the next steps in our staffing plans here at UPC.

With thanks to all who offered your feedback over the past month, on May 26th, at their stated meeting, the Session voted to begin our search for an Associate Pastor! Having already received the approval of the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry to proceed, we now need to form a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) to get the search started. A PNC is the first point of contact for any potential candidates for Associate Pastor, and, as such, they should be representative of the whole congregation.

We want to include folks who are long-time members as well as those who have been drawn to and joined our motley crew more recently. We want people from a variety of age groups and who have been involved in church in different ways. Each one should be a church member of integrity, who is:

- able to make a significant commitment of their time, energy, and very best wisdom;
- willing to accept this as a task of spiritual discernment, not being easily influenced by personal desires or congregational politics, but rather listening for the voice of God able to honor confidentiality.

As a group they need to be knowledgeable about the church and community and be willing to find answers if they don't know them.

Taking all of that into consideration, over the next few weeks you are all invited to submit names of people you think would be good PNC members - including your own - to Lois Kuyper-Rushing at PNC@upcbr.org. As suggestions are collected, the Congregational Nominating Committee will contact folks to see if they would be willing to be a part of the PNC. The congregation will get a list of all who agree to serve, if elected, at a congregational meeting later in June. Each congregation member present at that meeting will select their "dream team," but the top five individual vote getters overall will become our next search committee.

Once formed, the Pastor Nominating Committee will do much of the legwork, but to do any of this search well, the PNC and the church as a whole will need everyone's prayers and support. The good news is that you can offer that from anywhere and everywhere all summer long.





We know that crazy schedules and traveling means that church attendance is a bit more unpredictable in the summertime, so we won't be asking the kids to call us to worship each week while school is out. However, just because we won't be lighting the candle together on Sunday mornings, doesn't mean you can't do so at home!

We have a pillar candle for each UPC family with a pre-K-12th grader at home that you can pick up any Sunday, or you can use one you already have, or grab one from the dollar store. Light it at some point each day or each week just to remind yourselves that God is everywhere all the time and that you can always talk to God. You can light it at dinner together, when you offer a prayer (for someone's surgery, or someone's difficult meeting, when someone has the sniffles, or there's a challenging world event happening), or whenever, but try to pick a predictable time your kids and you can count on.

It's simple. It's inexpensive. It's unassuming. And yet, when that candle is lit, the reminder is there: the Holy Spirit is present in your home as well as at church - each and every day. Don't forget to blow it out together too, letting the smoke that rises serve as a continuation of your prayer and remembering that God is, indeed, everywhere.

#### TRANQUIL TUESDAYS

On Tuesdays we find peace and stillness through nature by observing observing something special about the world God created. We look for ways to appreciate nature and unwind in the beauty of our natural world! Put a star on the calendar when you complete the activity!

#### I WONDER WEDNESDAYS

On Wednesdays we'll talk about an open ended "I wonder" question that invites us all to think about something with curiosity and flexibility. Just spend a few minutes wondering together and put a star on your calendar.

#### THANKFUL THURSDAYS.

On Thursdays we think of the many things we are grateful for by naming a unique gratitude. After everyone shares, you can put your star on the calendar!

#### **FUN FRIDAYS**

On Fridays we do a fun activity together as a family. These ideas are suggestions, and you might choose something different to do together or modify the activity to better suit the ages and preferences of your family. Put a star on the day if you do something fun together for the day!

#### SERVICE SATURDAY

On Saturday we show our faith through acts of service. Sometimes the activities are within our own household or family and other times they are in support of the world around us. Add your star to the day when you complete your activity for the week!

#### REMINDERS

These activities are to help you build a habit. Don't try to be perfect!! If there's a day or activity that doesn't work for you, either complete the activity on a different day, or skip it altogether. Feel free to modify the activities to best suit your family. Have fun! You may know that UPC has made a commitment over many years to hospitality, care, and fellowship with our neighbors coping with HIV and AIDS. UPC maintained a long-term relationship with St. Anthony's Home in Baton Rouge which served individuals disabled by HIV and AIDS, and we valued our relationships and fellowship with St. Anthony's residents.

When St. Anthony's closed last year, your Mission and Peacemaking committee sought to continue our commitment to our neighbors experiencing HIV, and we researched and discerned new partners whom we could support in this work. UPC became a new community partner of Family Service of Greater Baton Rouge (FSGBR) last year. FSGBR is supported by The United Way, federal programs and community partnerships and has been assisting the health under-served community since the 1960's.

Specific HIV programs at FSGBR include:

- Ryan White Part A Program- Care Coordination, resources and programs that enhance health and well-being. This program assists with emergency financial assistance, transportation, utilities, medication and other supportive services.
- HIV Women & Children Program Assist clients to access services, resources and programs that enhance health and well-being. Services include: medical case management, support groups, counseling, health/treatment education, transportation, and emergency financial assistance.
- HIV, Counseling, Testing, Referral & Linkage to Carecombines HIV education, counseling, testing and referral services aimed at prevention, early identification of the HIV infection and linkage to medical care.
