[As we begin a new program year at UPC we are also beginning the search for an Associate Pastor. There will continue to be updates along the way, but here's your first installment from our Nominating Committee.]

Update from your Associate Pastor Nominating Committee

Your Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC) began meeting at the beginning of July and will meet weekly until we've found UPC's new Associate Pastor! We're currently working on writing UPC's "**Ministry Discernment Profile**" (MDP). Our MDP is basically UPC's resume, LinkedIn profile, or dating site profile, as that seems to be the most used analogy!

Once we have the MDP written, we will upload it to the CLC (Church Leadership Connection). This is a website, maintained by our denomination, on which churches seeking ministers are paired with ministers seeking churches. (Yes, like a dating website.)

What can you do to help?

Do you know anyone who's a minister (they don't have to be Presbyterian!) who would be perfect for UPC? Let them know that our profile will soon be available on the CLC website. The more we can get the word out that UPC is looking for our next Associate Pastor, the easier it will be for the right person to find us!

Pray for discernment and wisdom for the committee. Also, pray for the minister out there who will answer the call to come to UPC. We don't know who they are, and they don't yet know that they'll be coming to us, but our new Associate Pastor is out there right now and could use your prayers.

How will you know what's going on?

The committee promises to keep you updated through Minutes for Mission, Contact articles, and posts in our Facebook group (<https://www.facebook.com/groups/upcbr>). You'll also want to check out our Train of Progress, which will be on the wall in the hallway and will show you what step we're on in the process.

You're also always welcome to talk to any member of the committee about the process and what's going on. We can't always give out specifics (like the names of ministers we've considered or where they're from), but we're happy to talk anytime you'd like. You're on this journey with us, and we're all excited (and a little anxious) to see where this train is going!

SPOTLIGHT on FAITH FORMATION AT HOME

Each Sunday when we light a candle at church we say “God is everywhere, all the time, and you can always talk to God.” Noticing God’s presence in and around us is key to our faith, but it is also something we need to practice and a skill we need to help our kids develop as well.

One fun way to start this practice with younger kids might be to make a scavenger hunt. Make a list of things that they can find around the house. The list should include items that are easy to identify such as a blue vase as well as things that require them to do a bit of thinking like an object that reminds you of your grandparents. When they have collected all of the items, sit down and discuss what they found. Ask them why they picked each object. Talk about how some were very obvious and specific while others were not so simple and might even be subject to debate. We look for God in the world around us like they searched for items in this scavenger hunt. Sometimes we know God is at work because God’s action is very clear. Other times, we have to think and wonder where God is. Then share where you saw God that day or that week, and see if they can name a moment in their lives as well. Practice this at night before you go to sleep - kind of like sharing highs and lows!


Choir Notes

JOIN US FOR A MOVIE NIGHT!

“What if the word, “homosexual” was never meant to be in the Bible? On Saturday, August 10th UPC will host the makers of the documentary film “1946: The Mistranslation that Shifted a Culture” which follows the story of researchers tracing the origins of the anti-gay movement among Christians to a mistranslation of the Bible in 1946. The film features commentary from prominent scholars as well as opposing pastors, including the personal stories of the film’s creators. UPC is partnering with other area churches to coordinate the movie event.

While tickets for the movie are free, you must register to attend and receive the location of the film showing. The event will include a speaker and a discussion after the showing. The film is intended to open conversation respecting the views of Christians and non-Christians alike. It can be helpful for folks who are attempting to talk with family members and friends who differ in understanding. You can light your candle (and pick it up if you haven’t) when you have these conversations, or use it together with the Family Faith calendar on the next page. One idea is to light it as dinner begins, use the calendar as a prompt for conversation, and blow it out as dinner ends.



WHAT A SUMMER!!

UPC, you were busy in June, living out our faith in our community. First, we jumped back into the mix at the Holy Grill, which cooks and serves filling hot meals to the men, women, and children in the North Baton Rouge community on a weekly basis. The small core group relies on area churches for a helping hand; UPC was able to provide 20 volunteers to assist in serving those lunches June 3-7. Your Mission and Peacemaking committee thanks all those who volunteered, and we hope to participate again in the future as part of our outreach to improve food access for those in need.



Then, we were able help out with the first Summer Health Expo put on by our new partners in HIV support, Family Service of Greater Baton Rouge (FSBGR). (See *UPC and HIV Support Update* article)



UPC hosted a Together Baton Rouge Quarterly Leaders Dinner, where we nourished ourselves and our relationships with congregations and groups from all over the city, and discussed important strategies for this coming year – stay tuned for more opportunities to organize and engage with our TBR partners in the next few months.

UPCers also joined in two big community events all about fellowship with and welcome to all of our neighbors – World Refugee Day hosted by our partners the Louisiana Organization for Refugees and Immigrants (LORI), and the Baton Rouge PrideFest.



UPC joined in celebrating World Refugee Day with our partners at LORI, increasing awareness of the of the millions of refugees displaced from their home countries, the challenges faced as well as their significant contributions to their new communities.

At Baton Rouge Pride Fest, we had a fabulous day spreading our love to our community through our highly-in-demand stickers, applying “Beloved” temporary tattoos to some very cute babies (and teens and grown-ups, too!), and generally enjoying the fellowship with friends and neighbors and the joy of being surrounded by rainbows all day.

UPC and HIV Support Update

When our long term partner in HIV support, St. Anthony’s House, was closed a few years ago UPC found a new partner in HIV support, Family Service of Greater Baton Rouge (FSGBR). UPC volunteers were welcomed to their first Summer Health Expo in June where we had a chance to talk with many of the staff and see the vast and busy healthcare and outreach facility. See their programs at <https://www.fsgbr.org/our-team>. UPC volunteers gave out snacks, drinks, mini- bubble makers, temporary tattoos, and UPC brochures. We also provided a giant fan for outdoor aspects of the Expo. Thank you to everyone who participated.

RIP Medical Debt

The numbers are in and UPCers have contributed \$13,406.56 to combat medical debt in Louisiana. Because every dollar we give translates to \$100 of debt cleared, we were able to wipe away over ONE MILLION dollars of medical debt (\$1,340,656.00) which relieved a burden for over SIX HUNDRED people (609). The competition between the adult and youth church school classes was close, but the adults edged out the youth by \$613. Thank you to all who participated in this worthwhile cause!


