It still doesn't quite feel like "fall" to me here, but I am relishing the slightly cooler mornings. I have been walking each morning for the past six weeks or so, and I am better able to appreciate the slight changes that tell me the heat will come to an end. The word "steward" comes from two ancient roots: stig, or "path, hall, part of a house," and weard, or "guardian, person who watches over." To protect and care for a path, a house, a treasure - and not just our individual home or church, but also the wider community we all share, love, and serve.

Thank you in advance for being a part of this special time of year. Because of you, we are able to be stewards of God's love and grace in Baton Rouge, and I am delighted by that.

How to Give in Realm

Log into your Realm account at onrealm.org. If you don't yet have a realm account, please contact the church office. Once you are in your profile go to GIVING then +PLEDGE and a new pledge window will appear. Choose the GENERAL FUND for 2025, fill in how often you would like to pledge, from dates 1/1/2025 to 12/31/2025, and how much you would like to pledge. Realm will calculate the yearly total for you. When you are done click SAVE PLEDGE. It's that easy!

REMINDER:

If you change your pledge and have automatic payments sent through REALM, remember to update your bank information. REALM will not automatically do that for you.

How to Pledge Time/Talents

In your REALM account go to SERVING. Under SERVING you will see your "Serving Profile", "Assignments," and "Teams" information. Click on the ••• to edit days and times you are available to volunteer and to add skills. Under the OPPORTUNITIES tab on that page there is a list of available opportunities to get involved with UPC. You can browse by Role (specific task) or by Team (general area). Choose as many as you would like and a leader will be in touch with you.

Pledge Updates

If you made a pledge this year for the 2024 budget - first, thank you!

Pledges, of whatever amount, help us plan and allow us to operate with confidence throughout the year. Three quarters through the year we have collected a little more than 3/4 of our pledges, which is great news. If you aren't up to date with your pledge at this point though, that's okay! We know there are ebbs and flows to the year, and sometimes a pledge needs to be revised (down or up) when circumstances change.

We will be sending out updates this month by email to let you know what our records show, so please keep an eye out and check to make sure all is correct from what you know on your end. As you prayerfully consider your pledge for the 2025 year, please know that if you do automated giving, any change you make needs to be registered twice - once with your bank, and once with UPC.

What is Per Capita?

Each year UPC sends money to support our Presbytery, Synod, and the national church. We send \$87.07 per church member (per capita) in gratitude for the ways those bodies support us locally. This past year we had guest preachers who were in town through their work with the national church, and we have at least one more on tap for next year already! We are always well served by our synod contact for Disaster Recovery (though she has not had to do much recovery work with us in the past year... thank goodness), and it is through the work of the Presbytery that ministry candidates, like our own Matt McGraw, are supported as they move through the ordination process. If you are able to do so, would you consider adding \$80 to your giving this year to cover your per capita expense and help us be stronger together?



Ten Commandments Lawsuit Update

As you may recall, the Broadhurst-Williams family is one of the plaintiffs in a lawsuit challenging a recently enacted state law that requires the display of a state-adopted version of the Ten Commandments in every public-school classroom.

The case was filed on June 24, 2024, in the federal district court in Baton Rouge. On July 8, our attorneys filed a motion asking the court to temporarily prevent the State and local school-board defendants from implementing the law while the case is proceeding. The court recently stated that it would hear argument and evidence pertaining to our request on October 21. In the meantime, our attorneys and the attorneys for the state will file additional legal briefing.

We are very grateful for the support we have received from this community and others and will continue to keep you apprised regarding the progress of the lawsuit.





UPC has long partnered with Iris on their mission to empower survivors, prevent relationship violence, and promote justice for victims of domestic and dating violence, their children, and our communities. Iris received the donation of a former hospital, allowing them to both expand and improve their support of survivors of domestic violence in Baton Rouge and eight surrounding parishes. With expanded space, they support more families, as well as providing more - more services, longer stays to help people gather the resources they need to be independent, and more room for play, for art, for music, for healing, and for joy!

"WILL YOU SET THE PRISONERS FREE, AND NEVER BE THE SAME?" PART TWO!

Our mini-series on cash bail and pre-trial detention continues in Octoberplease join us! As part of UPC's Matthew 25 commitments to eradicate systems of oppression, Mission and Peacemaking and Faith Formation are joining forces to learn about monetary bail, how it leads to unjust outcomes for our neighbors, and what UPC can do to seek more justice and equity in our community.

At the "Digging Deeper" class on September 15th, we were pleased to welcome the head of Legal Services for the Baton Rouge YWCA, who educated us about the bail system and how it leads to inequity and perpetuates poverty without increasing public safety. She spoke about new glimmers of hope in Baton Rouge and actions we can take, such as supporting the YWCA's Community Bail Fund which reduces the disparate impact of monetary bail on our most vulnerable neighbors. She also gave us an exciting "preview" of big changes coming to the overall system of monetary bail in our city's largest court system.

On October 27th we will learn about these larger systems changes in more detail, when we welcome Niles Haymer, Deputy Director of Baton Rouge's Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC). Mr. Haymer will bring us a closer look at the new Pretrial Services Unit and how it will benefit those entangled in the justice system while also better ensuring public safety. He will discuss the existing bond monitoring processes and how they can lead to unfair and unequitable circumstances, and he will bring us examples of other initiatives from around the country that have helped to create a more fair and equitable system.

CUBA PARTNERS UPDATE

UPC has partnered with Getsemaní Iglesia (church) in San José de los Ramos Cuba since 1990, and together have shared faith journeys in many forms over the years. As a part of our partnership, UPC has been a member of the PC(USA) Cuba Partners Network (CPN), which works to facilitate, support, and strengthen the many US-Cuba Presbyterian church partnerships.

Cubans have always faced hardships because of a poor economy and privations that have resulted from imposed US policies. Life in Cuba has recently become even more difficult increased - scarcity of food, medicines, housing, and fuel; emigration; inflation combined with insufficient salaries and pensions; and the inadequacy of crucial welfare systems like education, health, and recreation. Conditions are worse than any time in recent memory.

The Synod of the Cuban Presbyterian Church (Iglesia Presbiteriana Reformada en Cuba, IPRC) has appealed to the CPN and other international partners for assistance in supporting and sustaining the IPRC in the face of this unprecedented need. The Cuban Synod is unable to adequately support, educate, and provide pastoral care to its constituent congregations and pastors. UPC's Mission & Peacemaking Committee has responded to this appeal with a donation of \$1,000 from our Local and Worldwide Missions fund in recognition of the plight of our Cuban brothers and sisters. This donation will not solve the situation but will have an impact.
