During Advent this year, as we have in some others, we are using resources from the creative group A Sanctified Art. This year the theme they have developed is called "Words from the Beginning." Here is some of what they have to say about it:

"Advent is a season of endings and beginnings. As the calendar year comes to a close, a new church year begins. Christ's birth ushers us into new ways of living and loving; and yet, the world as we know it spins madly on...Christ's birth offered a beautiful new beginning for shepherds and Magi alike-all the while, King Herod tried to bring Christ's story to an end. When we ourselves navigate seasons filled with endings and beginnings, we need reminders. We need words that can feel like steady ground, like a path for our feet to find as we step forward into the unknown.

We have crafted an Advent series filled with blessings, with the words we need to hear again and again as we begin a new season. We imagined the words Mary would speak to her newborn son. What scriptures and stories would she impart to him? What lessons would she teach him as he grew? And so, our weekly themes may feel like the lessons we teach to children, but in reality, these are lessons we continue to learn and relearn as adults. They may sound like the messages we impart to loved ones during special ceremonies or sacred rituals. We intentionally selected scriptures that may be frequently used in weddings, ordination services, or baptisms.

And so, we invite you to enter this Advent season as if you are entering a sacred new chapter, holding fast to the reminders that will bolster you for the journey ahead. As you journey through this season, may you find words for belovedness and hope. May you find words for beginning again. For no matter what you are facing, no matter what this new day brings, love is your beginning."

What are some of the stories of faith that keep you going? What are the words you want to make sure your children or grandchildren know? The world is always beginning again; you can always begin again. What helps you find hope, peace, joy, and love, and how can our community accompany you as you seek any or all of it?

I look forward to starting this new year with you, both in December and in January.






SPOTLIGHT on FAITH FORMATION AT HOME



Mission & Peacemaking

Like many of you, your Mission and Peacemaking committee spent time considering the results of the presidential election and what they mean for our way forward. To borrow from author and researcher Brene Brown, we talked about the experience of despair, and the role of hope, which is not an emotion but "a cognitive behavioral process. It's about having a goal, a pathway to achieve that goal, and a sense of 'I can do this.'" She went on to say, "Right now, the thing that is helping the most is micro-dosing hope. I have no access to big hope right now, however, I am asking myself how I can support the people around me. How can I make sure that...I stay committed to courage, kindness, and caring for others." So UPC, how are you micro-dosing hope in these times? Here are a few things on the minds of your M&P Committee:

We are grateful to share our kindness and caring with our neighbors in need - many immigrants and refugees in our community feel very anxious right now, and we know that our partner organization LORI is working hard to support them. Stay tuned for the opportunity to share our support and fellowship with our immigrant and refugee neighbors, at LORI's end of the year banquet on Dec. 20th.

We are hopeful to be a part of the PCUSA's Matthew 25 movement, joining with many congregations in our commitments to eradicate systemic poverty and dismantle structural racism. We see now more than ever how these structures are poison to our democracy and to God's desire for our world, and so we are glad to keep learning how to become better tools for dismantling them. Look out for a fellowship activity next year where we will participate in the "Racial Wealth Gap Simulation," helping us to better understand and talk about policies that perpetuate inequity in our country.

We are hopeful in our support for the Power Coalition for Equity and Justice, which engages in the deep work of building power and fully engaging Louisianans- especially communities of color- in all aspects of civic life. We were glad to direct 25% of UPC's Peace and Global Witness offering to the Power Coalition to support their ongoing work.

And, many of us were blessed with the opportunity to join with Habitat for Humanity on a beautiful sunny Saturday, bringing Ms. Shelah and her family one step closer to a home they can call their own. Alleluia!
