## Bible Study



## **Digging Deeper**

Beginning today and running four weeks (thru Feb. 2), Meredith Veldman will be teaching a Digging Deeper class called "Religion and Resistance"-- Between June and December 1989, a remarkable series of largely non-violent, people-powered revolutions toppled authoritarian communist regimes in Poland, Hungary, East Germany, Czechoslovakia, and Romania. In these extraordinary events, Christian churches played important roles. This class will take a look at these too-often forgotten revolutions, and explore what hope they might offer Christians today as the threat of authoritarianism grows more real.
