I subscribe to a number of email newsletters, and in one from the theologian and writer Diana Butler Bass, she offered a meditation on the phrase, "Increase our faith!" from Luke 17:5. In her meditation she reflects on other three world theologies that can be found in scripture:

Here I Am Don't Be Afraid Love Your Neighbor Go, Do Likewise

There are lots more (God Is Love, Peace on Earth, Pray Without Ceasing... and more), but sometimes it feels like those messages get overwhelmed by other three-word theologies that take up a lot more airtime these days. A few came to mind quickly:

Get Rich Quick On Sale Now Resistance Is Futile Health Makes Wealth

After a few deep breaths I can admit those first answers come from my frustration and fears. I think they are fair, but they are not the whole story, and if Lent teaches me anything it is that you often have to take a beat - to pause for a moment - to begin to see a fuller picture of things. So I waited a few days, and here were others that I could see:

Can I Help? You Are Mine (in a good way...) I Hear You Thanks So Much

It got me wondering what my three-word theology would be, and yours too. We are still in Lent for a few weeks, but as we move toward and into the season of Easter (remember, it's not just a day!) what three words are guiding your journey with Jesus? What three words are summing up your longings right now? What three words speak to your heart?

BUDGET QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ABOUT UPC PROPERTY


At the UPC "Family Budget" meeting on February 9, there were several questions about our HVAC system and other property matters.

- 1. What is cost of the new HVAC system? How will we pay for it?
 - We've received quotes exceeding \$260,000. We have some money set aside for major maintenance but will likely need to use some of our investment funds.
- 2. What is the estimated savings in utilities and maintenance with a new HVAC system?

This is unknown. The existing HVAC system was built in the 1940's. Its boiler, pumps, and cooling system break down repeatedly. It requires constant maintenance, is a huge energy hog, and leaks water. This replacement will be an improvement in energy usage, but is primarily a reliability project. When it fails completely – not if – our 1st floor offices, classrooms, library, and Fellowship Hall will be unusable.

3. What other items besides HVAC need to be fixed or replaced?

There are many concerns that the Property Committee are managing. A potential major concern is the health of our underground drainage piping, some of which is clay. Also, the Fellowship Hall/Office HVAC is one of 11 HVAC systems at UPC, several of which are over 15 years old and may be problems in the future.

Volunteer at LSU's Take Back the Night Event

UPC's Mission and Peacemaking committee is supporting the Take Back the Night event being hosted by LSU's Feminists in Action student organization, on Wednesday, April 23rd from 6-8:30 p.m. at Memorial Tower on LSU's campus. The purpose of this event is to raise awareness about interpersonal violence, provide support for survivors, and create a safe and inclusive community.

Take Back the Night began in the late 1800s in the UK as a protest to the fear that women experienced while walking alone at night. The event has expanded globally and now serves to oppose sexual and intimate partner violence. The Baton Rouge community has had a TBTN for over thirty years, and UPC has often joined at these events. Racial Wealth Gap Simulation – What Next?

"Really enlightening and helpful!" "Thanks so much for putting it all together!"

"Thanks for organizing that program, it was an eye-opener!" "I knew of some policies/history, but not all". "Great program but what next?" These are some of the reactions to the Racial Wealth Gap Simulation held on Sunday, March 16 in the fellowship Hall, immediately following Sunday worship. This event was jointly sponsored by the Mission and Peacemaking (M&P) and the Fellowship Committee.

After a delicious lunch, 28 UPC members and five facilitators from the Presbytery of South Louisiana's Racial Reconciliation Committee sat down to discuss how 13 specific federal policies have created and sustained the gaps in wealth, income, and hunger between white and black Americans, and by extension, the systemic racial discrimination that all communities of color confront. As a Mathew 25 church, the members of M&P believe that this simulation is consistent with UPC engaging in the three core pillars of the Mathew 25 movement: building congregational vitality, dismantling structural racism and eradicating systemic poverty.

In a nutshell, the simulation involved each participant in a group of 7-8 being randomly assigned a race (Black or White). Following the review of each policy, participants were instructed to either take or relinquish dollars, land, or opportunities depending on how that policy impacted people of their race. In the end, white participants held 13 times more dollars than black participants. This symbolizes the proportional difference between the median net worth of white households (\$141,900) and of black households (\$11,000) in the United States.

We are very pleased that despite strong competition from the St. Patrick's Day Parade, UPC showed up! Thank you! The comments following the simulation as well as the discussions that ensued in each small group reflected the impact of the simulation. One participant asked, "What next?" We call your attention to one of the objectives of the simulation: to "incorporate a racial equity lens into our daily work, life, worship, policies, practices, and advocacy." To that end, we invite you to pay attention and participate in the initiatives in which M&P engages on an ongoing basis. A Special Offering for the YWCA's Revolving Bail Fund, supporting the National "Mother's Day Bailout" is the next such initiative. We also invite you to share your ideas with us about how we can incorporate a racial equity lens in our programs. Finally, we hope that you use the information you learned to inform and strengthen your professional and personal conversations about racial equity. So much of "What next?" depends on you!



"This Little Light" is a podcast for kids and their grown-ups who want to grow in faith together. Each week on Wednesday they explore a bible story, learn a new way to pray, or talk about something we can do to live out our faith. (The intent is to have fun too!) The podcast is geared toward littles - probably from 3-7, though you might check it out to see whether it hits a sweet spot for your own kid/grandchild/fun neighbor friend if they're not in that range. The podcast is only ten minutes long, so try it out and see what you think!


