

#### Easter Art Installation -

Throughout Easter we will continue to look at the hands that remind us both that we are held by God and that we are invited to walk through the door between grief and hope that the Resurrection offers us. Because those hands frame our beautiful window, we are reminded that the invitation is to go outside the church to do the work of the messy middle that is our calling because of the Resurrection. The butterflies, themselves a symbol of new life, are made of newsprint and painted with bright colors to remind us that while we must take into account bad news, we do not know what will come tomorrow. The light of Christ, unlit through Lent but now shining, leads the way so we can follow. Thanks to Caralyn Durham for her help with the banners; Christopher Cunningham, Patti Snyder, and Jim Hanifen for their help making the butterflies; and Richard Williams and Jaxon Clark for their help getting the butterflies into place.
