In 1954, the Internal Revenue Service revised its code through what is now known as the Johnson Amendment, which states that nonprofit organizations may not "participate in, or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for public office." This provision does not, and was not intended to, prevent churches from commenting on political issues themselves.

Houses of worship remain free to hold educational forums, inform candidates of their positions on various issues, express opinions on ballot measures, lobby legislators, and commend or criticize the actions of elected officials - among other things. In fact, in 1970, the Supreme Court affirmed this right, noting: "Adherents of particular faiths and individual churches frequently take strong positions on public issues... Of course, churches as much as secular bodies and private citizens have that right."

The amendment's primary aim was to prohibit candidate endorsements, under penalty of losing tax-exempt status—a penalty that, notably, has only been applied once, after a church purchased full-page newspaper ads opposing presidential candidate Bill Clinton. However, just last month, in settling a lawsuit, the IRS issued this statement:

When a house of worship in good faith speaks to its congregation, through its customary channels of communication on matters of faith in connection with religious services, concerning electoral politics viewed through the lens of religious faith, it neither "participate[s]" nor "intervene[s]" in a "political campaign," within the ordinary meaning of those words.

The statement went on to liken such speech to a "family discussion."

Contrary to popular opinion, this settlement is currently binding only in the Eastern District of Texas, where the lawsuit was filed. The actual IRS code is unchanged, and it remains unclear how this decision will be interpreted more broadly. My guess is that the ambiguity will lead to plenty of future litigation.

Regardless, I want you to know two things:

- First, I do not believe it is appropriate to endorse political parties or candidates from the pulpit, and you will not hear me do so. Would that any could measure up to the call our faith puts upon us.
- Second, I will continue to reflect theologically on the policies and actions that are put forward or enacted at every level of government. I believe our faith compels us to live together in ways that show forth love, embrace welcome, pursue justice, and offer grace. And to the extent that our laws and collective choices either help or hinder our ability to follow Christ in these ways, I will likely have something to say about it.

Tales from our Attic! by Mary Mikell

Doug Walker led the effort to clean out our church attic making space for the new HVAC. Gaines Foster went through about 20 boxes of old church files that were hauled down. Most of the boxes contained financial records from the 1980s and 1990s and were thrown away or shredded with the help of Ignace Agbadan. Among the more interesting finds were:

- an onion skin transcript of a 1922 Billy Sunday sermon, we donated to the library at Grace College, which houses Sunday's papers. The archivist was most appreciative.
- A nine or ten box collection of sermons and papers of Parks Wilson we donated to LSU's Special Collections at Hill Memorial Library. These records will become the Parks Wilson Papers in Special Collections.
- A 1979 thank you letter from Sam H. Pho, President
 of the Vietnamese Buddhist Association in BR. He
 wrote, "We would like to express our gratitude for
 having let us the facility of your church for our prayer
 for the Dead's Ceremony. Having fled our country for
 the right to religious freedom, the kindness of you and
 your church is deeply appreciate by the Vietnamese
 Buddhist community in Baton Rouge."

I told Nancy, Arch Tolbert's daughter, about this letter, and she had a story of a phone call she got from Joe Delpit soon after her father died. Joe said he was running for the BR City Council, first black man to do this, and no place in BR would allow him to hold desegregated meetings as he wanted the white community to hear what he wanted to do, not just the black community. Arch heard about this, and offered the UPC sanctuary for the meeting. The rest is history. Delpit was elected to the Metro Council and served two terms. He then served 17 years in the state legislature.

- "Bless This Mess" (parents group) moves to a newly decorated upstairs classroom.


Small Groups

CECIL JARREAU'S GOURMET STYLE JAMBALA RECIPE

- 1 fryer or boneless thigh meat (3 lb)
- 1 1/2 lb smoked sausage, sliced 3/8" thick
- 3 large onions
- 5 celery stalks
- 2 bunches of green onions
- 1 bunch parsley
- 1 small bell pepper
- 3 pods garlic

- 5 cups rice
- 8 cups water
- 2 tbsp salt
- 1 tsp black pepper
- 2 tbsp Kitchen Bouquet
- 1 tsp garlic powder
- Tobasco to one's own taste

Use an 8-quart Magnalite or cast-iron pot. Brown sausage with a little oil, then remove, leaving grease. Chop onions, celery, bell pepper, garlic, green onion bottoms, and parsley stems; set aside green onion and parsley tops. Season chicken (cut into serving pieces) with Creole seasoning. Cook chicken in pot with 1 cup onions and 1/2 cup celery until done or debonable. Remove chicken and grease, reserving grease.

Sauté vegetables (onions, celery, bell pepper, garlic, green onion bottoms, parsley stems) in 1/2 cup reserved grease until celery softens. Debone chicken while vegetables cook. Combine chicken, sausage, water, seasonings, green onion tops, and parsley tops in pot. Bring to a rapid boil, stirring occasionally. Add rice, bring to a boil again, stir, cover, and reduce heat to simmer. After 15 minutes, gently stir to avoid gumminess. Cover and simmer 10-15 more minutes. Remove from heat, let sit, and stir once before serving.

Serve with salad, white beans, and French bread.

A NEW WAY TO GET TO KNOW EACH OTHER!

Do you ever wish you knew the name of the person who always sits two rows ahead of you in church? Do you hear about people in the church doing certain things, but have no idea who they are? Would you like to make it easier for our new Associate Pastor Erin to get to know us? The Membership Committee's got a plan for that!

Starting this fall, we are going to create permanent name tags that will be available for all members, children from first grade on up, and for frequent visitors. New visitors will have temporary write-on paper tags available.

The badges will be small and plastic, with a magnetic attachment that will go on the back so there will be no damage from pins. For those with pacemakers who need to avoid the use of magnets, the tags themselves are not magnetized. You will be able to place your tag free from the magnetic backing in a lanyard, which will be available near the name tags.

The tags will be arranged by last name on steel whiteboards near the Fellowship Area, so they will be available before and after church. And if you end up taking yours home, just wear it the next time you come to church. But please, don't put them through the laundry!
