Bible Study

- "Religion, Race—and Reparations?"
 - Gaines Foster's class continues Oct. 26, Nov. 2 and Nov. 9.
 - Beginning with the origins of American slavery in the 1600s and continuing until today, this class provides an overview of the history of how Christians and their churches (with some emphases on the role of Presbyterian churches) supported and sometimes challenged America's racial system. It ends with a discussion of the Presbyterian Church USA's discussion of the possibility that the nation's racial past merits reparations for African Americans.
