Every Thanksgiving, the Butterball Turkey Helpline receives thousands of calls from panicked home cooks. Questions about internal temperature (175°) or if you can thaw a turkey in the dryer (no). They're the ones to call. Wouldn't it be nice if there were a hotline for other Thanksgiving concerns though?

What if you're not quite thawed out, not prepared to meet your cousin's boyfriend or hear your uncle's fascinating theories? What if you haven't stocked up on courage to try your sister's new questionable casserole or you didn't bring enough patience to manage political differences? What if Grandma is not there with her signature dish? Or what if there are other empty chairs? What if you're the only chair you know will be filled, and you wish that weren't the case? Alongside all the joy of gathering and feasting, holidays are a cornucopia of mixed emotions smothered in expectations.

Gratitude can get buried under all the questions and the stress.

Maybe we need a Gratitude Helpline for when our stomachs are full but our hearts feel empty. Someone to dish out heaping spoonfuls of grace when there's too much other stuff on our plates, bring a serving of inner peace for our sleepless midnight snack. Maybe we need seconds of gumption to be who we are, or at least to keep loving who we are, in the company of folks who seem to be holding on to who they want us to be.

Maybe it's not an actual phone number to call, but (as you know) God is everywhere all the time, and you can always talk to God - who is ready to answer, toll-free, day or night, year-round, never a busy signal. Though you can pray in the midst of chaos, if you begin to feel overwhelmed, maybe it's worth taking a walk around the block or going to a quiet room (even the bathroom...) for a few minutes. You can take a few deep breaths, talk about the questions or concerns you have, and ask for the clarity, healing, patience, forgiveness, or compassion you need. Stepping back may be just what you need to find a blessing in your situation, and the gratitude that comes with that may allow you to step back in the fray for a little while.

The holidays can be a wonderful time, but they aren't all gravy and dessert. If you need some help don't hesitate to check in with God and with folks who love you at UPC. But if you need turkey help? Call Butterball.

Stewardship & Finance

Rooted and Reaching

We are very grateful that 77 households have made financial pledges to the church for 2026. So far we have 6 new pledges, and 45 folks have increased their pledge! Thank you! We know that all who have turned in a commitment have made considered decisions about the ways you are able to support UPC going forward.

If you intend to pledge but have not yet done so, it will be very helpful if you can do so soon. We put together our annual budget by first looking at our pledges, as they are the best indicator of the financial landscape available to us. If you are unable to give financially this coming year, don't fret, it's ok! It will help if you can let us know that is the case so we can budget responsibly.

We remain more than appreciative for the many ways each of you gives of your time and talents to make UPC the loving community it is. We literally couldn't do it without you!

Year-End Financial Giving

As we approach the end of the year, here are some key details about financial gifts to UPC to ensure they qualify for 2025 tax purposes.

Pledges & Cash Gifts

All year-end gifts, pledges, special offerings, and designated contributions must be postmarked by December 31. The church office will be closed from December 24 - January 2, so any in-person deliveries must be received by December 22. If you pay your 2026 pledge online in 2025, we'll first apply funds to any outstanding 2025 balance before allocating the remainder to 2026.

Gifts of Stock

We encourage thoughtful stewardship by considering the benefits of donating appreciated stock instead of cash.

- You avoid capital gains tax on the stock's growth.
- The full fair market value at the time of transfer is tax-deductible.

Many members find this a smart giving strategy—please consult your financial advisor to see if it's right for you.

To count toward 2025, securities must be received by the Texas Presbyterian Foundation (on UPC's behalf) no later than Tuesday, December 22. Contact Drew Patty in advance for transfer instructions. Per church policy, all stock gifts are sold immediately, with proceeds deposited into UPC's account.

How to Give in Realm

Log into your Realm account at onrealm.org. If you don't yet have a realm account, please contact the church office. Once you are in your profile go to GIVING then +PLEDGE and a new pledge window will appear. Choose the GENERAL FUND for 2026, fill in how often you would like to pledge, from dates 1/1/2026 to 12/31/2026, and how much you would like to pledge. Realm will calculate the yearly total for you. When you are done click SAVE PLEDGE. It's that easy!

REMINDER:

If you change your pledge and have automatic payments sent through REALM, remember to update your bank information. REALM will not automatically do that for you.

Mission & Peacemaking

Hope for the Holidays

UPC is excited to once again be participating in the Hope for the Holidays program, run by Presbyterian Children's Home and Services (PCHAS), to provide holiday gifts for children in our community. We will be distributing names later this month, so keep an eye out for our table in the Welcome Center before and after services.

Cuba Update

Those following recent conditions will be aware of the dire circumstances facing our brothers and sisters in Cuba, exacerbated by the recent rash of infections by the Dengue, Chikungunya, Oropouche, and Zika viruses, transmitted by mosquitos and biting midges. Nearly fifty members of our partner church in San José de los Ramos are fighting or recovering from infections, including Pastor Josué and his wife Danely. Symptoms include fever, severe headache, and severe muscle and joint pain that can last for weeks and may lead to meningitis, encephalitis, and even death in already compromised individuals. At least two in the congregation have died. There is no treatment except for analgesics and nutritional and symptomatic support that are unavailable to most in Cuba.

After an appeal from Pastor Josué for medical and nutritional support supplies, UPC members responded with over \$3,000 in donations, with more on the way. These funds have been expended through a web site called Supermarket23 that permits purchase of medical and grocery supplies in Cuba. Items we've been able to provide include ibuprofen and acetaminophen, (including child formulations - we wiped out their available stock), multi-vitamins, B-complex vitamins, vitamin C, mosquito coils, chicken, ground meat, sausages, gelatin, noodles, eggs, milk, tomato purée, instant drink mix, detergent, and bath soap. Our most recent shipment arrived Friday (10/17). Depending on funds availability and feedback from Josué, we will continue to provide support. Please keep our Cuban brothers and sisters in your prayers.

Peace and Global Witness Offering Update

On October 5th UPC joined congregations far and wide in taking up the Peace and Global Witness offering. This offering enables the church to promote the Peace of Christ by addressing systems of conflict and injustice across the world. Local congregations retain 25% of the offering to support peacemaking in local communities, with the encouragement to "find and address the anxiety and discord that is prevalent throughout this broken and sinful world." Your Mission and Peacemaking committee determined to direct the local amount (\$395.25) of the offering to our good friends at LORI (Louisiana Organization for Refugees and Immigrants). LORI is working hard to support our immigrant neighbors as they struggle through this time of intense anxiety and discord- and UPC is grateful to be able to contribute to their work.

2026 Budget Planning

In early October, a dedicated group gathered to prepare and finalize the DS budget for 2026. We have made significant progress this year, but we are not yet self sustaining. We need more students to be able to offer more hours and increased pay for our dedicated teachers.

Faith Formation 2025

As individuals and as a church community, we are always forming and reforming our faith. It's what makes us Presbyterians and what enlivens our understanding and our response to God's love for each of us at this time and in this place.

To encourage our faith-forming journey, we offer these classes on Sunday mornings this fall.

For Children and Youth:

Babies - kindergarten: in the nursery

 1st-7th - Act Up! - 2nd floor in Room 204 - Each month, this class will study a different Bible story and create a unique way to tell that story as part of our worship service.

Act Up! Update!

You may have noticed that once a month, our worship service includes a new component: a dramatic enactment of the scripture lesson by UPC's very own drama troupe: Act Up!, consisting of our 1st through 7th graders.

- •On Sept. 7, we introduced Act Up! to the congregation with a "Rhyme Read" of the Creation story, followed by "Jacob's Ladder" on Sept. 27. Oct. 26 was our first full-fledged play, "Elijah Hears God's Voice." We'll be participating in the worship service again on Nov. 30, and then joining with the 8th-12th graders for a Nativity play on Dec. 21.
- 8th-12th Follow Me 2nd floor in Room 206 -Fall themes for this curriculum-based class include spiritual disciplines, joy, following Jesus, and hope.

For Adults:

Bible Study

This group uses the "Living the Word" curriculum which follows the Narrative Lectionary used in worship. Themes for this fall include: "God Provides Blessings", "Encountering the Messiah", and "God's Kingdom Revealed". Class volunteers lead the round table discussion on scripture that will be preached on in worship. Meet in the Conference Room.

Bless This Mess!

This adult discussion is a class for adults who are raising young people, babies through college-age. We discuss issues and concerns that come up for "kids these days" in the context of their (and our own) spiritual formation. The format is democratic and flexible, depending on the needs and whims of those present; in the past, we have had book studies and discussed podcasts.

This class will meet on the 2nd floor in Room 208.

Digging Deeper

This class explores various topics using a lecture and discussion format. This class meets in the Parks Wilson Room near the Sanctuary.

• Religion, Race—and Reparations?
Gaines Foster's class meets Nov. 2 and Nov. 9. Covering American slavery from the 1600s to today, it examines how Christians and churches (emphasizing Presbyterians) supported and sometimes challenged the racial system, ending with the PCUSA's debate on reparations for African Americans.

• Nov. 16 Brian Hightower from the Greater Baton Rouge Food Bank will be there to discuss the local food bank operations, challenges and opportunities.

UPCOMING FOR ADVENT:

This year, we will have a special four-week devotional series for adults happening during Advent! The book is <u>Taste and See: Experiencing the Stories of Advent and Christmas</u> by Jan Johnson. Books can be ordered from most major booksellers, or you can contact Erin if you need assistance. To ensure everyone has the opportunity to participate, there will be three different times offered: Sunday mornings at 9:30 during the Sunday school hour, Tuesday mornings at 10 a.m. at the church, and a to-bedetermined weekday evening.
